

ASSIST – Directions to View Articulation Agreements

Go to: www.assist.org

- 1) Under: “Explore Transfer Information”, click on scroll bar arrow and select “De Anza” (or another institution)
- 2) Go to scroll bar arrow and select appropriate academic year, wait till page refreshes
- 3) To see how De Anza courses articulate in general terms on a system-wide basis, go to De Anza College Courses Applicable to Transfer section, and click on specific type:
 - CSU Transferable Courses
 - CSU GE-Breadth Certification Courses
 - CSU US History, Constitution, and American Ideals Courses
 - IGETC for UC and CSU
 - UC Transferable Courses
 - UC Transfer Admission Eligibility Courses – identifies courses that will fulfill minimum UC admissions eligibility areas (aka: 7-course pattern)

To view Agreements with Other Campuses – go to section, click on scroll bar arrow, select second institution, go to appropriate section:

- **By Major** (shows lower-division major preparation courses/articulation)
- **By Department** (shows course-to-course agreements only, does not show how courses apply to specific requirements)
- **For General Education Breadth** – this option only pertains to UC campus specific-GE patterns.

General Notes:

- To print, click on orange “print this report” button at top
- Community college courses will always appear in the right column
- If “By Major”, “By Department” or “For General Education Breadth” does not appear, this means that particular campus chose not to create such an agreement.
- The introductory paragraphs found on most “by Major” agreements are important as it usually spells out critical transfer information for students – such as, when a course must be complete prior to transfer or how far back a course could be taken and still meet a requirement.
- Watch out for sequences and series, quarter system courses are often articulated as a sequence and the entire sequence must be completed in order to meet a specific requirement
